# School Uniform Policy

<u>Uniform Clarification</u>- Our school uniform is compulsory. The clothing is easily available from high street stores. Sweatshirts, polo shirts, fleeces and cardigans with the school's logo embroidered into them are available from Castle Green, Gale Street, Dagenham. The uniform consists of the following: **Boots may only be worn in bad weather**.

Winter Uniform Expectation - White shirt, blouse or polo shirt. Royal blue sweatshirt, cardigan or fleece (with/without school logo). Black trousers or skirt. White or black socks or tights. Sensible black shoes. Boots may be worn in bad weather and all footwear should have flat heals for health and safety reasons



<u>Summer Uniform Expectation</u> - (The same as winter but with the below options) Black trousers or shorts (smart, not PE shorts). Blue and white checked cotton dress. White or black socks

<u>PE Uniform Expectation</u> - Royal blue sweatshirt. Black jogging bottoms or shorts. Plain white tee shirt. White/black socks. Plain black trainers (no logos)

# TARTAN CLOTHING IS NOT IN OUR SCHOOL POLICY

Children must not wear make-up, fake nails or nail varnish. Dyed hair, shaven heads and logos/ symbols cut into the hair are <u>not</u> allowed. Coloured weaves or braids are not allowed. Long hair must be tied back. Children can wear hair accessories. These can consist of small blue/white hair ties, hair bands or hair grips which are not distracting to the child themselves or to other children.

### Parents Evening - Telephone Calls

Parent Telephone Consultations are just as important this year, as they would be if Parents were expected to attend. You would have all received your allocated date and time which you should stick to due to the tight schedule that the teachers will currently be working with. We ask that all parents make the time to take the calls. This Parents Evening is especially important after everything we have been through as a community. It will give you the chance to get feedback on how your child has settled in since returning to school, their readiness to learn and how we are supporting them to catch up on missed learning. Teachers will also discuss with you any issues around punctuality, homework, uniform/PE kit and behaviour. Never has it been more important for parents and teachers to have this dialogue.

We would like your child to be present at the time of the call. Calls will last a maximum of 10 minutes as they would if they were our traditional face-toface meetings. If an issue arises that needs to be investigated, a follow up meeting will be arranged. We will make every effort to ensure that calls to families with more than one child do not clash but please let us know if there are any issues.



We have had a very large increase in dinner money debt. Going forward, the school will be contacting parents/guardians with large debt and advising that they will need to provide a packed lunch until debits are cleared. This will then minimise and reduce the

numbers of debits within the school. If you feel that your child may be entitled to Free School Meals you can complete an application form which we have in the school office.
