

School Routines

- The gates open at 8:35am. Children walk into school. Gates close at 8:40am.
- Assembly is at 10:30am
- Break time is at 10:45am
- Lunch is at 12:00pm 12:45pm
- Home time is at 3:05pm Children cannot be collected by any child under the age of 14 and are unable to walk home alone until they are in Year 6
- Children that have not been collected will be taken into the building to be collected at the main office at 3:15pm

Punctuality and Attendance

- At DBJA we celebrate attendance in a variety of ways: attendance parties, badges, certificates, 100% pencils.
- Regular attendance means that your child can make the most of their education, which will improve chances in adult life and also helps them make and keep friendships.
- We expect all children to attend school if they are well enough to do so. A phone call is expected to be made by parents informing the school of any failure to attend school and reasons why.
- We do not authorise any term time holidays, regardless of reasons and we also encourage any essential appointments to be made outside of school hours or in the afternoon to maximise the day's learning.
- We also expect good punctuality.
- As a school we monitor attendance and punctuality and a member of the attendance team will be in touch with you to arrange a meeting if we have concerns about your child's punctuality or attendance.

Uniform Expectations



- Black trousers, skirts, black socks or tights, white socks
- White polo shirt, shirt or blouse
 - The shirt does not need to have the school logo
- Blue jumper or cardigan
 - The jumper or cardigan does not need the school logo
- Hair ties that are small and do not distract from learning
- Black shoes
- No make-up, nail varnish, jewellery, shaved logos or dyed hair
- Please note, tartan pinafores are not part of our school uniform

Class Dojo and Barley Olympics

- Children earn Dojos by following the Golden Rules and Learning Values!
- The child with the highest number of Dojos each day will be the Dojo champion and will take home a Top Dojoer ticket.
- The two children from each class that receive the highest number of dojos during the year will be rewarded with a prize/trip.
- The class with the highest number of dojos in each year group will win a reward and trophy at the end of each half term. These are our Barley Dojo Olympics winners.

Winners can choose from: Non-uniform day, 30 minutes of Just dance, Watching a short film/TV show, Arts & Crafts, Board games, Maths games on iPads or 15 minutes extra play time.





Negative Behaviour

- Children who receive -2 Dojos will miss 5 minutes of their lunch time or break time with their teacher to reflect on their behaviour.
- Children who receive -4 Dojos will attend a lunchtime 'reflection' where they
 will spend the first 15 minutes with Miss Stanborough. Every child that is sent
 to 'reflection' will have a reflection form to complete and your parents will be
 spoken to about your behaviour.
- If a child receives more than five reflections, parents will be informed that any further incidents will result in their child automatically missing the whole of their lunch break following any further incidents.





Playground behaviour at DBJA

We have high behaviour expectations in school and the following behaviour will NOT be tolerated:

Fighting - including play fighting

Rough Play - pushing, shoving, grabbing or any physical contact

Inappropriate language – including swearing

Sexualised language and behaviour

Racist, homophobic, bi-phobic, transphobic, or disablist comments

Children will immediately receive -4 dojos, parents will be informed and they will attend reflection. There may also be further consequences.
